What you should know about the latest

Big Freeze and plant protection

The following information on how to care for plants that have been damaged by frost comes from the folks at the University of Arizona, Extension Service. DO NOT CUT BACK your dead foliage until the end of February at the earliest and possibly until early March to avoid losing otherwise healthy plants. Keep plants well watered, frost injury occurs when ice crystals form on the leaf surface, drawing moisture from the leave tissue. This damage from dehydration will be less severe if the plant is not drought-stressed. Keep your irrigation moisture level as even as possible. As most folks know, plants should be covered with cloth or paper when a freeze is forecast, never with plastic. Coverings should be removed during the day. When dealing with trees, wrap the trunks during a freeze to protect the tree. Again, do not prune frostdamaged plants until the plant begins growing in the spring. Early pruning might stimulate new growth which would be vulnerable to late frosts. Frost damaged leaves and stems will continue to help trap warm air within the canopy. Note that damage is often not nearly as bad as it initially looks, new growth may come out of tissue that looked dead.
